>Garden Director's Report, Corey Barnes

Reporting Period: April and May 2022

- The garden shined for Spring Tour. Corey is extremely grateful to the Board for their confidence and permission to expand garden maintenance spending this fiscal year. The results were reflected in the comments of too many visitors to track.
- Corey expresses additional gratitude to the horticultural team, Dirty Knees volunteers, and our indispensable contractors, without whom our success our result would not have been possible.
- The horticulture team and Dirty Knees team are proud, energized, and ready to work toward Spring Tour 2023.
- We earned \$2861 from the Garden Club of Palo Alto Charitable Trust to be used in the Allée for field bindweed eradication. Total requested was \$4264; balance of request may be available, update anticipated from GCPA Project Funding Committee.
- We earned \$2000 from the Atherton Garden Guild to be used for garden projects, as we designate.

From Veronica Thao and the Edible Garden:

Highlight: Tulips were grown in the Edible Garden for the first time! Blossoming in late March to early April, they were quite the highlight for visitors, adding a new level of spark and color and blending well with the vegetable crops. **Seasonal Transition:** The Edible Garden continues its seasonal transition from a winter to summer garden. Occurring more gradually than it has been in the past two seasonal gardens, beds are changed out after their winter crops have been harvested. The beds are prepped and planted soon after.

By Spring Tour, the Edible Garden beds were full, consisting of mature winter garden or young summer garden plants. There were blossoming mustards, Brussels sprouts and kale, strawberries, peas, marguerite daisies, pansies, calendula, California poppies and marigolds (all edible flowers). The blooms accentuated the colors of the vegetable plants: purple and green cabbages, mustards, kale, peas and rainbow chard. The formerly espalier bed took off in growth, with some of the sunflowers reaching 3 feet tall already, having been planted only a few weeks prior.

Produce Harvest: Starting in mid-November to early May, the winter edible garden has produced 543 pounds of produce such as 4 different types of cabbages, chartreuse, lavender-pink or dark purple cauliflower, rainbow chard, yellow, purple and green peas, green and purple broccoli, and rosy, green or dark red lettuce. Most of the harvests are donated to the Downtown Food Closet Food Bank at Saint Episcopal Church, 0.6 miles from Gamble. We look forward to when the summer garden starts fruiting!

- Rear staircase repair: Bruce Drummond was able to quickly repair/strengthen the staircase before Spring Tours began.
- Gazebo: dry rot and termite damage to the beams and rafters require repair and replacement. We have talked to Chris and received a quotation from Kyle at Michael Meyer Woodworking.
- Ceilings: LR & DR need to patch and plaster; have 2 bids (including McKenna Plastering). Followed by painting
 of ceilings and walls.
- LR needs removal of inappropriate ceilings molding; have 2 bids. LR needs to shorten and repair the chandelier.
- DR needs to replace two ceiling fixtures with appropriate lights.
- Library needs painting of ceiling and walls
- Wood paneling: LR, DR & entry need refurbishing; received 2 bids including one from Gus at McDermaid Painting.

- Wood floor: refurbish all wood floor on the ground level. In addition to the one price quotation from White Oak, we have met with Trevor with Stuart Floors, Caribbean Floor and Hector from Patrick Floors, which gave us a quotation much higher than White Oak.
- Miniblinds: replace with appropriate window treatment
- Comprehensive work: Gus at McDermaid Painting has submitted a bid for comprehensive work including restoring ceiling plaster in 3 rooms, restoring wood areas in the same rooms, painting the library wood areas, and painting the living and dining room walls

Enhancement Projects Action Status Report:



Our field trips utilize every corner of Gamble Garden as source content for experiential, inquiry-based learning.** We deliver 90–120-minute field trips via small student to guide ratios, with participation of 15 members of our knowledgeable and talented guide organization. The schools provide a minimum of one chaperone for every 8 students. The revenue (\$5 per student) totaled \$1500 and had associated costs of \$60.

^{**} The exception this year was Nixon Elementary which was unable to leave campus due to Covid. We adapted our curriculum and delivered it on their school grounds. The curriculum addressed plant life cycle and functions of the six main plant parts. We explored their campus for signs of wildlife and plant-animal interaction and discussed the needs of plants (water, sunlight, air, soil.). We do not anticipate offering off site field trips in the future.

2. Delivered a fun and successful April Second Saturday -- three local poets created a new way to look closely at plants in our garden that grow wild around the world. Attendance 200. Partnership with the Santa Clara Chapter of the CA Native Plant Society. This free event had no associated cost.

The theme was "Take a Walk on the Wild Side." People of all ages worked with three guest poets to "see" what is wild in the garden and put their reflections into poetry. We partnered with the Santa Clara chapter of the CA native plant society, who brought many examples of wildflowers, wild plants and wildflower seeds to hand out.

- 3. Delivered one public tour (14 attendees) and one private tour (40 attendees) these were paid tours with no associated cost. Revenue is \$8-10 per person.
- 4. Planned, prepared, delivered May Second Saturday. Conducted a training zoom for guides (16 attendees.) This month we partnered with Garden Club of Palo Alto, Geo Kids, and Bayer Ballet. Attendance was 240. It had no direct costs and as always was free.

The theme was "Fun with Flowers." The Palo Alto Garden club provided a children's flower arranging workshop and kids got to take home vases of flowers to their families. We also worked with Veronica Thao to offer an exploration of edible flowers at Gamble Garden with some closely controlled tasting opportunities.

Announcements to the board:

- Second Saturday is a free community program which is run by volunteers and has little to no associated cost.
 The exception is the annual lunar new year celebration at February Second Saturday; fortunately, its costs were
 fully covered by a sponsor donation. In general, Second Saturday has neither cost nor revenue associated with it.
 However, we are exploring the possibility with the Fund Dev Comm of inviting businesses and individuals to
 sponsor a Second Saturday ultimate goal would be to have a sponsor for the majority of the 12 months.
- Second Saturday tours, public and private tours, and school field trips have one thing in common a guided tour. One key principle the guides teach is respect for the garden. Among other things, this includes the simple rule of staying on the paths. We like to say "let's be sure not to step on a garden bed! Imagine if a giant stepped on your bed you wouldn't like it, would you. Let's take care of the plants and all the living creatures in the soil by not stepping on their beds." We are happy to have the Learning Laboratory, the brick patios, and the DG space behind the tea house to run our various large group activities on Second Saturdays keeping wear and tear on the lawns and beds to a minimum.
- On Monday, June 20, Garden Guides and Docents will hold a recruitment/enrichment session and pot luck dinner on the Teahouse Patio.
